## **GRADE 12 CLIMATE CHANGE ACTION PROJECTS**

Ms. Epp's Chemistry 12 class completed a "Climate Change Action Project" in second term. Students chose a problem related to climate change, did research, and proposed a solution, which they acted on and shared with others. We would like to share with you the most outstanding projects and will feature one or two each month. We hope you enjoy them and learn something to help mitigate climate change.

#### **JANUARY PROJECT:**

**DIY Anaerobic Digester** By Tayler Sanford and Fyfer Brookes Gillingham



What: For our climate change action, we created an mini DIY anaerobic digester. Anaerobic digesters intake compost and food scraps to produce biogas, which mostly consists of methane gas. They do this by depriving bacteria of oxygen, therefore forcing them to digest the compost anaerobically and produce methane gas.

Why: Six percent of the carbon emissions come from food scraps in landfills; this isn't counting the carbon emissions that come from food scraps produced by farms. Most of these emissions come in the form of methane gas, which is 25 times more potent as carbon dioxide at trapping heat in the atmosphere. This means that if we were to burn this methane gas produced by food scraps into carbon dioxide, we'd actually reduce global emissions and utilize a sustainable energy source that would have otherwise been thrown away.
